We celebrate the birth of Jesus during the Christmas season, one of the most beautiful seasons in the liturgical year.

The Christmas season begins with the celebration of Mass on Christmas Eve and lasts until the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord.

On the Feast of the Epiphany, we celebrate Jesus' revelation to the whole world, which is represented by the Magi, or three Wise Men.

During Christmas we hear about Bethlehem, the city of David, where Jesus was born. In Hebrew, *Bethlehem* means "house of bread."
