Polskie Duszpasterstwo w Parafii św. Bernarda i św. Stanisława Kostki



4 NIEDZIELA ZWYKLA

«Błogosławieni ubodzy w duchu, albowiem do nich należy królestwo niebieskie» (Mt 5, 3).

Dobrą rzeczą jest zawsze czytanie i rozważanie Błogosławieństw! Jezus proklamował je w swoim pierwszym wielkim kazaniu, na brzegu Jeziora Galilejskiego. Był tam wielki tłum, a On wyszedł na wzgórze, aby nauczać swoich uczniów, dlatego jest ono nazywane «Kazaniem na Górze». W Biblii góra jest postrzegana jako miejsce, gdzie objawia się Bóg, a Jezus głoszący kazanie na wzgórzu jawi się jako Boży Nauczyciel, jako nowy Mojżesz. A co głosi? Jezus wskazuje drogę życia, tę droge, którą On sam idzie, a wręcz którą On sam jest i przedstawia ją jako drogę do prawdziwego szcześcia. W całym swym życiu, od narodzin w grocie w Betlejem, aż po śmierć na krzyżu i zmartwychwstanie, Jezus był ucieleśnieniem Błogosławieństw. W Nim wypełniły się wszystkie obietnice królestwa Bożego.

Głosząc Błogosławieństwa, Jezus zachęca nas, byśmy Go naśladowali, byśmy wraz z Nim szli drogą miłości, jedyną, która prowadzi do życia wiecznego. Nie jest to droga łatwa, ale Pan nam zapewnia swoją łaskę i nigdy nie pozostawia nas samych. W naszym życiu obecne są ubóstwo, ucisk, upokorzenia, walka o sprawiedliwość, trudy codziennego nawrócenia, walka, by żyć powołaniem do świętości, prześladowania i wiele innych wyzwań. Ale jeśli otworzymy drzwi Jezusowi, jeśli pozwolimy, aby był On obecny w naszej historii, jeśli będziemy z Nim dzielić radości i smutki, to doświadczymy pokoju i radości, które może dać tylko Bóg, nieskończona miłość.

Błogosławieństwa Jezusa niosą rewolucyjną nowość, wzór szczęścia będącego przeciwieństwem tego, co jest zwykle przekazywane przez media, przez dominujący sposób myślenia. Dla mentalności świata zgorszeniem jest to, że Bóg przyszedł, aby być jednym z nas, że umarł na krzyżu! W logice tego świata ci, których Jezus nazywa błogosławionymi, są uważani za «przegranych», za słabych. Gloryfikuje się natomiast sukces za wszelką cenę, dobrobyt, arogancję władzy, autoafirmacje kosztem innych.

Jezus wzywa nas, abyśmy odpowiedzieli na Jego propozycję życia, abyśmy zdecydowali, jaką drogą chcemy iść, żeby osiągnąć prawdziwą radość. Jest to wielkie wyzwanie wiary. Jezus nie bał się zapytać swoich uczniów, czy chcą rzeczywiście pójść za Nim, czy też raczej odejść i chodzić innymi drogami (por. J 6, 67). A Szymon zwany Piotrem miał odwagę powiedzieć: «Panie, do kogóż pójdziemy? Ty masz słowa życia wiecznego» (J 6, 68). Jeśli i wy będziecie umieli powiedzieć Jezusowi «tak», to wasze młode życie wypełni się znaczeniem i tym samym będzie owocne.

Ale co to znaczy «błogosławieni» (po grecku makarioi)? Błogosławiony znaczy szczęśliwy. Powiedzcie mi: czy naprawdę pragniecie szczęścia? W epoce, w której jesteśmy pociągani przez liczne iluzje szczęścia, grozi nam, że zadowolimy się byle czym, że nasza wizja życia będzie mało ambitna. Dążcie natomiast do tego, co wielkie! Poszerzcie wasze serca!

Jeśli naprawdę pozwolicie, by ujawniły się najgłębsze oczekiwania waszego serca, to zdacie sobie sprawę, że jest w was niegasnące pragnienie szczęścia, a to pozwoli wam zdemaskować i odrzucić wiele «tanich» ofert, jakie znajdujecie wokół siebie. Kiedy poszukujemy sukcesu, przyjemności, egoistycznego posiadania i czynimy z tego bożki, możemy nawet doznawać chwilowego upojenia, fałszywego poczucia zaspokojenia, ale w końcu stajemy się niewolnikami, nigdy nie jesteśmy zadowoleni, jesteśmy pobudzani, by szukać coraz więcej. Bardzo smutno widzieć młodzież «sytą», ale słabą.

Ludzie młodzi, którzy wybierają Chrystusa, są silni, karmią się Jego Słowem i nie «opychają się» innymi rzeczami! Miejcie odwagę iść pod prąd. Miejcie odwagę prawdziwego szczęścia! Powiedzcie «nie» kulturze tymczasowości, powierzchowności i odrzucenia, która nie wierzy, że potraficie podołać odpowiedzialności i zmierzyć się z wielkimi wyzwaniami życia!
