#### PRESENTATION OF JESUS THE LORD

#### First Reading: Malachi 3: 1-4

The prophet Malachi speaks to us about God sending a messenger "to prepare the way" and that God will suddenly come and appear at the temple. Malachi continues by telling us the offerings of Judah and Jerusalem will be pleasing to God.

#### Second Reading: Hebrews 2: 14-18

Jesus became like us. He shared fully in our humanity. By his death he freed us from the fear of death. Because Jesus was tested by suffering, he is able to help those who are also tempted.

#### Gospel: Luke 2: 22-40

According to the law of Moses, Joseph and Mary brought Jesus to the temple to be consecrated. They offered a sacrifice according to the law, "a pair of turtle doves or two young pigeons."

Simeon, a holy and righteous man, took the child into his arms and praised God. Simeon then spoke to Mary. He told Mary that Jesus "is destined to be the downfall and the rise of many in Israel." Anna, a prophet of great age, praised God and spoke of the child who came for the redemption of Jerusalem.

#### The Saint of the Week

# St. Blaise

#### (February 3)

Saint Blaise was the bishop of Sebastea and a doctor. The first known record of the saint's life comes from the medical writings of Aëtius Amidenus, where he is recorded as helping with patients suffering from objects stuck in their throat. Many of the miraculous aspects of St. Blaise's life are written 400 years after his martyrdom in the "Acts of St. Blaise."

It is believed that Saint Blaise began as a healer and eventually, became a "physician of souls." He then retired to a cave, where he remained in prayer. People often turned to Saint Blaise for healing miracles.

In 316, Agricola, the governor of Cappadocia and of Lesser Armenia, arrested Bishop Blaise for being a Christian. On their way to jail, a woman set her only son, who was choking to death on a fish bone, at his feet. Blaise cured the child, and though Agricola was amazed, he could not get Blaise to renounce his faith.

Therefore, Agricola beat Blaise with a stick and tore at his flesh with iron combs before beheading him.

In another tale, Blaise was being led to the prison in Sebastea, and on the way came across a poor old woman whose pig had been stolen by a wolf. Blaise commanded the wolf return the pig, which it did -alive and uninjured - to the amazement of all. When he reached Sebastea, the woman came to him and brought two fine wax candles in an attempt to dispel the gloom of his darkened cell.

In the Middle Ages, Blaise became quite popular, and his legend as a beast tamer spread. He was then referred to as the "saint of the wild beast."

Many German churches are dedicated to Saint Blaise, sometimes called Saint Blasius.

In Great Britain, the village of St. Blazey got its name from Saint Blaise, and a church dedicated to the saint can be found in Decon hamlet of Haccombe, near Newton Abbot. There is a Saint Blaise's Well in Kent, and the water is believed to have medicinal properties.

A Catholic middle school was named after Saint Blaise in Bradford, West Yorkshire. The name was decided upon when the link between Bradford and the woolen industry was connected to the way St. Blaise was martyred: with woolcomb.

Saint Blaise is often depicted holding two crossed candles in his hand, or in a cave with wild

animals. He is also often shown with steel combs. The similarity of the steel combs and the wool combs made a large contribution to Saint Blaise's leadership as the patron saint of wool combers and the wool trade.





# Welcome Bishop Elias Lorenzo



This Sunday, our parish community will be visited by our regional Bishop. Bishop Lorenzo will be present at the 9AM and 11AM Masses.



Jest rzeczą interesującą zaobserwować z bliska to wejście Dzieciatka Jezus w uroczystym dniu świątyni, w wielkim zgiełku tak wielu osób, zajętych swoimi sprawami: kapłanów, lewitów z ich kolejami posługi, licznie zebranych pobożnych wiernych i pielgrzymów, pragnących spotkać się z Bogiem, świętym Izraela. Nikt z nich jednak nie zdaje sobie sprawy z tego co się dzieje. Jezus jest dzieckiem jak wiele innych dzieci, pierworodnym synem dwojga bardzo zwyczajnych rodziców. Także kapłani okazują się niezdolni odczytania znaków nowej i zupełnie szczególnej obecności Mesjasza i Zbawiciela. Tylko dwoje staruszków, Symeon i Anna, odkrywa wielką nowość. Przywiedzeni przez Ducha Świętego, odnajdują w tym Dziecięciu spełnienie ich długich oczekiwań i czuwań. Oboje kontemplują Boskie światło, które przychodzi, by oświecić świat, a ich profetyczne spojrzenie otwiera się na przyszłość, jako zwiastowanie Mesjasza. W profetycznej postawie obojga starców zawarte jest całe Stare Przymierze, które wyraża radość z powodu spotkania z Odkupicielem. Ujrzawszy Dziecię, Symeon i Anna czują, że to właśnie ono jest tym Oczekiwanym.

Przedstawienie Jezusa w świątyni stanowi wymowną ikonę całkowitego oddania swojego życia dla tych wszystkich mężczyzn i kobiet, którzy zostali powołani, aby odtwarzać w Kościele i świecie, za pomocą rad ewangelicznych, "charakterystyczne rysy Jezusa dziewiczego, ubogiego i posłusznego". Dlatego też dzisiejsze Święto zostało wybrane, by świętować doroczny Dzień Życia Konsekrowanego.

Ewangeliczny obraz Przedstawienia w Świątyni zawiera fundamentalny symbol światła, które wychodząc od Chrystusa, promieniuje na Maryję i Józefa, na Symeona i Annę, a poprzez nich na wszystkich. Ojcowie Kościoła wiązali to promieniowanie z duchową wędrówką. Życie konsekrowane wyraża taką wędrówkę, w sposób szczególny, jako "filokalię", umiłowanie piękna Bożego, odbicie Boskiej dobroci. Na obliczu Chrystusa jaśnieje światło takiego piękna. Z drugiej strony, ewangeliczny obraz zawiera proroctwo, dar Ducha Świętego. Symeon i Anna, kontemplując Dzieciątko Jezus, przewidują Jego przeznaczenie śmierci i zmartwychwstania dla zbawienia wszystkich narodów i ogłaszają to misterium jako zbawienie powszechne. Życie konsekrowane jest powołaniem do takiego profetycznego świadectwa, związanego z jego podwójnym charyzmatem kontemplacyjnym i apostolskim. Osobom konsekrowanym, mężczyznom i kobietom, został udzielony bowiem dar zwiastowania prymatu Boga, pasja dla Ewangelii przepowiadanej jako forma życia i zwiastowanej ubogim i ostatnim na ziemi.

Po trzecie, ewangeliczna ikona Ofiarowania Pana Jezusa w świątyni ukazuje mądrość Symeona i Anny, mądrość życia oddanego zupełnie poszukiwaniu Bożego Oblicza, jego znaków, jego woli: życia oddanego zupełnie słuchaniu i głoszeniu Jego Słowa! Życie konsekrowane w świecie i w Kościele jest widzialnym znakiem tego poszukiwania oblicza Pana i dróg, które do Niego prowadzą. Osoba konsekrowana świadczy więc o zobowiązaniu, radosnym i jednocześnie pracowitym, ciągłego (wytrwałego, upartego) i mądrego poszukiwania Bożej woli.

Drodzy bracia i siostry, bądźcie wytrwałymi słuchaczami Słowa, ponieważ wszelka mądrość życiowa rodzi się z Bożego Słowa! Naśladując Chrystusa czystego, ubogiego i posłusznego staje się w ten sposób żywą "egzegezą" Bożego Słowa. Duch Święty, mocą którego zostało napisane Pismo Święte, jest tym samym, który rozświetla nowym światłem Bożego Słowa założycieli i założycielki. Z Niego wytrysnął każdy charyzmat, a każda reguła chce być jego wyrazem, dając początek drogom życia chrześcijańskiego znaczonym ewangelicznym radykalizmem."

# From Fr. Marcin's Desk

#### Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The Feast of the Presentation of Jesus at the Temple is also known as the Feast of the Encounter. This is the encounter between Jesus and His people, when Mary and Joseph brought their child to the Temple in Jerusalem; there the first encounter between Jesus and His people, represented by Simeon and Anna, took place.

In the encounter between the Holy Family and the two representatives of the holy people of God, Jesus is at the center. It is He who moves everything, who draws all of them to the Temple, the house of his Father.

It is a meeting between the young, who are full of joy in observing the Law of the Lord, and the elderly who are full of joy in the action of the Holy Spirit. It is a unique encounter between observance and prophecy, where young people are the observers and the elderly are prophets! In fact, if we think carefully, observance of the Law is animated by the Spirit and the prophecy moves forward along the path traced by the Law. Who, more than Mary, is full of the Holy Spirit? Who more than she is docile to its action?

In the light of this Gospel scene, let us look at consecrated life as an encounter with Christ: it is He who comes to us, led by Mary and Joseph, and we go towards Him guided by the Holy Spirit. He is at the center. He moves everything, He draws us to the Temple, to the Church, where we can meet Him, recognize Him, welcome Him, embrace Him.

In the consecrated life we live the encounter between the young and the old, between observation and prophecy. Let's not see these as two opposing realities! Let us rather allow the Holy Spirit to animate both of them, and a sign of this is joy: the joy of observing, of walking within a rule of life; the joy of being led by the Spirit, never unyielding, never closed, always open to the voice of God that speaks, that opens, that leads us and invites us to go towards the horizon.
