

Polskie Duszpasterstwo w Parafii św. Bernarda i św. Stanisława Kostki 3 Niedziela Adwentu

Kazanie św. Augustyna, biskupa

Jan jest głosem, ale "na początku było Słowo", czyli Pan. Jan był głosem tylko do czasu, Chrystus jest Słowem odwiecznym.

Czym jest głos bez słowa? Jest pustym dźwiękiem, który niczego nie oznacza. Głos bez słowa dźwięczy w uchu, ale sercu nie przynosi pożytku.

Rozważmy, w jakim porządku dochodzi do wzbogacenia serca. Gdy myśle o tym, co mam powiedzieć, wtedy słowo rodzi się w moim sercu; a jeśli chcę ci coś powiedzieć, staram się wzbudzić w twoim sercu to, co już istnieje w moim.

W tym celu posługuję się głosem i mówię do ciebie, aby słowo, które jest we mnie, mogło dotrzeć do ciebie i przeniknąć do twojego serca. Dźwięk głosu pozwala ci zrozumieć słowo. Ten dźwięk mija, ale słowo przezeń niesione dotarło do twojego serca, a równocześnie pozostaje i w moim sercu.

Czyż ten dźwięk niosący słowo nie przypomina ci sam przez się, że "trzeba, by On wzrastał, a ja żebym się umniejszał"? Dźwięk głosu spełnił swoje zadanie i przebrzmiał, jakby mówiąc w ten sposób: "Ta moja radość doszła do szczytu". Trzymajmy się słowa, nie dajmy, aby się ono zagubiło, gdy już poczęło się w tajnikach naszego serca.

Czy chcesz stwierdzić, że głos przechodzi, a Słowo Boga trwa? Gdzież jest teraz chrzest Jana? Jan go udzielał i przeminął, teraz zaś przyjmuje się chrzest Chrystusa. My wszyscy wierzymy w Chrystusa, wyczekujemy zbawienia w Chrystusie, a o tym powiedział nam głos.

Trudno jest odróżnić głos od słowa, toteż Jana uważano za Chrystusa. Głos utożsamiano ze słowem. Ale Jan wyznał, że jest tylko głosem, i nie chciał uchodzić za tego, którym nie był. Rzekł więc: "Nie jestem Mesjaszem ani Eliaszem, ani prorokiem". Wtedy zapytano go: "Kim więc jesteś?" I odpowiedział: "Jam głos wołającegpustyni:

Prostujcie drogę dla Pana". Głos wołającego na pustyni, głos przerywający milczenie, by prostować drogę Panu. To znaczy: mój głos rozlega się po to, aby wprowadzić Pana do waszych serc; lecz jeśli nie naprostujecie drogi dla Niego, to nie przyjdzie On tam, dokad chce Go wprowadzić.

Cóż jednak oznacza prostować drogę? Modlić się gorąco. Co oznacza prostować drogę? Uniżyć się. Patrzcie na przykład dany wam przez Jana Chrzciciela. Ludzie uważają go za Mesjasza, ale on nie ukrywa, że Nim nie jest, i nie karmi swojej próżności błędnym mniemaniem ludzi.

Gdyby powiedział: Jestem Mesjaszem, jakże łatwo by mu uwierzono, skoro brano go za Mesjasza, zanim jeszcze wypowiedział się na ten temat. Ale on się tego wystrzega, mówi, kim jest, uniża się i nie równa z Chrystusem. Wie, skad płynie dla niego zbawienie; rozumie, że jest tylko lampą, która płonie i świeci, i lęka się, aby nie zgasił jej podmuch pychy.



The people of Olkusz in Bohemia in 1431 had every reason to be suspicious of their new pastor. They knew what a Krakow professor would think of their small rural town. But even more insulting, their town was once again being used as a dumping ground for a priest who was "in disgrace."

John had indeed been kicked out of his university position -- unjustly. Rivals who resented John's popularity with the students had cooked up a false charge against him. John was not even allowed to appear at his own hearing or testify in his own defense. So at age 41, he was shipped off to be an apprentice pastor.

Certainly no one would have blamed John if he was furious at such injustice. However, he was determined that his new parishioners would not suffer because of what he happened to him.

But there was no overnight miracle waiting for him in Olkusz. He was nervous and afraid of his new responsibilities. And, despite the energy he put into his new job, the parishioners remained hostile. But John's plan was very simple, and came not from the mind but from the heart. He let his genuine interest and concern for these people show in everything he did. Despite working for years without any sign of success, he was very careful not to

demonstrate impatience or anger. He knew that people could never be bullied into love. so he gave them what he hoped they would find in themselves.

After eight years, he was exonerated and transferred back to Krakow. He had been so successful that these once-hostile people followed him several miles down the road, begging him to stay.

For the rest of his life, he was professor of Sacred Scripture at the university. He was so well-liked that he was often invited to dinner with nobility. Once, he was turned away at the door by a servant who thought John's cassock was too frayed. John didn't argue but went home, changed into a new cassock, and returned. During the meal, a servant spilled a dish on John's new clothes. "No matter," he joked. "My clothes deserve some dinner, too. If it hadn't been for them I wouldn't be here at all."

Once, John was sitting down to dinner when he saw a beggar walk by outside. He jumped up immediately, ran out, and gave the beggar the food in his bowl. He asked no questions, made no demands. He just saw someone in need and helped with what he had.

John taught his students this philosophy again and again, "Fight all error, but do it with good humor, patience, kindness, and love. Harshness will damage your own soul and spoil the best cause."

John put all his effort into a new and frightening job, that others might have considered beneath him. Today do something you have never done before or do something in a new way, perhaps something that has frightened you or you felt was beneath you. This can be something as simple as trying a different type of prayer or as complex as serving others in a new way.

From Fr. Marcin's Desk

On this third Sunday of Advent, called the Sunday of "joy", the Word of God invites us on the one hand to joy, and on the other to the awareness that existence also includes moments of doubt, in which it is difficult to believe. Joy and doubt are both experiences that are part of our lives.

To the prophet Isaiah's explicit invitation to joy: "The desert and the parched land will exult, the steppe will rejoice and bloom," the Gospel contrasts with doubt of John the Baptist: "Are you the one who is to come or should we wait for another?" Indeed, the prophet sees beyond the situation: he has discouraged people before him: those with weak hands, faltering knees and lost hearts. It is the same reality that in every age tests faith. But the man of God looks beyond, because the Holy Spirit makes his heart feel the power of his promise, and he announces salvation: "Courage, do not fear! Here is your God, [...] He comes to save you." Then everything is transformed: the desert blooms: consolation and joy take hold of the lost heart; the lame, the blind, those who can't speak are healed. This is what is accomplished with Jesus: "the blind regain their sight, the lame walk, the lepers are purified, the deaf hear, the dead rise, the poor have the Gospel proclaimed to them."

This description shows us that salvation envelops the whole person and regenerates him. This new birth, with the joy that accompanies it, always presupposes a death to ourselves and to the sin that is in us. Hence the call to conversion, which is the basis of the preaching of both the Baptist and Jesus; in particular, it's about converting the idea we have of God. The time of Advent stimulates us to this precisely with the question that John the Baptist asks Jesus: "Are you the one who must come or do we have to wait for another one?" We think: all his life John has waited for the Messiah; his way of life, his own body is shaped by this expectation. For this reason, too Jesus praises him with those words: no one is greater than him among those born of a woman. And yet, he too had to convert to Jesus. Like John, we too are called to recognize the face that God has chosen to take in Jesus Christ, humble and merciful.

Advent is a time of grace. It tells us that it is not enough to believe in God: it is necessary every day to purify our faith. It is a question of preparing to welcome not a fairy-tale character, but the God who challenges us, involves us and before whom a choice is imposed.
