SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT

First Reading: Isaiah 40:1-5, 9-11

Isaiah emphasizes that from the desert to the mountains. all people must prepare for "the glory of the Lord to be revealed." Rather than looking only at God's power, Isaiah focuses on God's kindness, comparing it to a shepherd who feeds and cares for his flock.

Second Reading: II Peter 3:8-14

For those who are impatient for the Second Coming, Peter explains that time is different to God than to people. He reminds them that they should be grateful for the extra time to prepare, and concentrate on striving to become all that God would want them to be.

Gospel: Mark 1:1-8

In this passage, John the Baptist stressed the importance of the coming of the Messiah. He acknowledged that he was only the messenger, and unfit to "stoop and untie his sandal straps." John urged them to prepare for one far holier than he, who would walk among them.

The Saint of the Week

St. Lucy

(December 13)

St. Lucy is a virgin and martyr of Syracuse in Sicily, whose feast is celebrated on December 13th. According to tradition, Saint Lucy was born to rich and noble parents in the year 283. Her father was of Roman origin, but his early death left her dependent upon her mother, whose name was Eutychia.

Lucy had consecrated her virginity to God, and she hoped to devote all her worldly goods to the service of the poor. Her mother, Eutychia, arranged a marriage for her, but for three years she managed to postpone the marriage. Lucy prayed at the tomb of Saint Agatha to change her mother's mind about her faith. As a result, her mother's long haemorrhagic illness was cured, and she consented to Lucy's desire to live for God.

Saint Lucy's rejected bridegroom, Paschasius, denounced Lucy as a Christian. The governor planned to force her into prostitution, but when guards went to fetch her, they could not move her even when they hitched her to a team of oxen. The governor ordered her to be killed instead.

After a gruesome torture which included having her eyes torn out, she was surrounded by bundles of wood which were set afire, but the fire quickly died out. She prophesied against her persecutors, and was then executed by being stabbed to death with a dagger. The meaning of her name is "light" or "lucid" which led to her patronage with eyes.

Polskie Duszpasterstwo w Parafii św. Bernarda i św. Stanisława Kostki



2 Niedziela Adwentu Rok B

Niekiedy zbyt słaby jest bodziec popychający nas ku Bogu i zdaje się niemal, że Bóg milczy... dlatego nawrócenie jest przede wszystkim łaską, o którą trzeba Go prosić. Istotnym elementem nawrócenia jest pragnienie poszukiwania Boga, które ostatecznie, dzięki Jego łasce, prowadzi nas do komunii z Nim.

Przykład Jana Chrzciciela, wskazującego swoim współczesnym drogę do nawrócenia. Jest to analogiczna droga, jaką proponuje nam obecnie Adwent. Nawrócenie to przede wszystkim proces, co wiąże się ze "zmianą kierunku i orientacji. Chodzi zatem o zmianę mentalności.

Z nawróceniem wiąże się żal z powodu popełnionych grzechów, pragnienie uwolnienia się od nich, postanowienie wyrugowania ich z życia na zawsze. Aby wykluczyć grzech, trzeba także odrzucić wszystko, co się z nim wiąże: mentalność światową, przesadne cenienie wygody, przyjemności, dobrego samopoczucia, bogactwa. Przykład tego oderwania przedstawia nam po raz kolejny dzisiejsza Ewangelia w postaci Jana Chrzciciela: człowieka surowego, który wyrzeka się rzeczy zbędnych i szuka tego, co istotne. Oto pierwszy aspekt nawrócenia: oderwanie od grzechu i światowości."

Inny istotny element nawrócenia, wiąże się z pragnieniem "poszukiwania Boga i Jego królestwa". Dlatego nie jest celem samym w sobie rezygnacja z wygód i mentalności świata, lecz ma to nas prowadzić do osiągnięcia komunii z Bogiem.

Proces "zmiany mentalności" to trudna droga:

"Istnieje bardzo wiele więzów, które trzymają nas blisko grzechu: niestałość, zniechęcenie, niegodziwość, szkodliwe środowisko, złe przykłady. Niekiedy zbyt słaby jest bodziec popychający nas ku Bogu i zdaje się niemal, że Bóg milczy. Jego obietnice pocieszenia wydają się nam odległe i nierealne, podobnie jak obraz opiekuńczego i troskliwego pasterza, który rozbrzmiewa dziś w czytaniu z proroka Izajasza (por. Iz 40, 1, 11). Wówczas mamy pokusę, by powiedzieć, że prawdziwe nawrócenie jest niemożliwe, i zamiast nawrócić się od świata do Boga, grozi nam trwanie w "ruchomym piasku" kiepskiego życia."

Nawiązując to tych trudności, że nawrócenie jest przede wszystkim łaską, o którą należy "zdecydowanie prosić Boga". Otwierając się na Jego dobroć i czułość, jesteśmy w stanie porzucić to, co "fałszywe i ulotne, dla tego, co jest prawdziwe, piękne i trwa wiecznie".

From Fr. Marcin's Desk

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

For a week we have been experiencing the liturgical Season of Advent: a season of openness to the preparation for Holy Christmas when the Lord came to dwell among this fallen humanity to renew it from within. A message full of hope resounds in the liturgy of Advent, inviting us to raise our gaze to the ultimate horizon, but at the same time to recognize the signs of the God-withus in the present.

On this Second Sunday of Advent the Word of God announces to the Israelites liberation at last: "Comfort, comfort my people", the Prophet says in God's name. "Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that her warfare is ended" (Is 40: 1-2). This is what the Lord wishes to do in Advent: to speak to the heart of his people and through it to the whole of humanity, to proclaim salvation. Today, too, the Church raises her voice: "Make straight in the desert a highway for our God" (Is 40: 3). For the peoples worn out by poverty and hunger, for the hosts of refugees and for all who are suffering grave and systematic violations of their rights, the Church stations herself as a sentinel on the lofty mountain of faith and proclaims: "Behold your God! Behold, the Lord God comes with might" (Is 40: 10).

This prophetic announcement is fulfilled in Jesus Christ, who with his preaching and, later, with his death and Resurrection, brought the ancient promises to fulfilment, revealing an even deeper and more universal perspective. He inaugurated an exodus that was no longer solely earthly, in history, hence temporary, but rather radical and definitive: the transition from the kingdom of evil to the Kingdom of God, from the dominion of sin and death to that of love and life. Therefore, human hope goes beyond the legitimate expectations of social and political liberation because what Jesus began is a new humanity that comes "from God," but, at the same time germinates on our earth, to the extent that it lets itself be fertilized by the Lord's Spirit. Thus, it is a question of fully entering the logic of faith: believing in God, in his plan of salvation, and at the same time, striving to build his Kingdom. Justice and peace are in fact gifts of God, but require men and women to be the "good ground" ready to receive the good seed of his Word.
